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Monday: 1 Corinthians 1

What does it mean to be sanctified in Christ Jesus and called to be holy? How does this apply to your life? Reflect on the concept of God's wisdom versus human wisdom. Can you provide examples from your life where you experienced this contrast? How does the idea that God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise affect your understanding of God's Kingdom?

Tuesday: 1 Corinthians 2

How does Paul's approach to preaching challenge the way the gospel is sometimes presented today? What does it mean to have the "mind of Christ", and how can we develop it? Reflect on the contrast between the spiritual and natural person. Where do you see these two types in your life?

Wednesday: 1 Corinthians 3

What does this chapter teach us about unity and division within the church? What does it mean for us to be co-workers in God's service? What does it mean to value God's wisdom over worldly wisdom?

Thursday: 1 Corinthians 4

How does the concept of being a steward of the mysteries of God apply to your life? How can you emulate Paul's humility in your leadership roles? What does it mean to imitate Paul as he imitates Christ?

Friday: 1 Corinthians 5

How can we apply the principle of not tolerating "a little leaven" in our personal lives? How does the metaphor of leaven speak to you in maintaining your personal moral integrity? How does Paul's instruction about not associating with immoral believers challenge you in your personal relationships?

Saturday: 1 Corinthians 6

In what ways can the church today apply Paul's advice about handling disputes internally? What steps can you take to ensure your behavior aligns with the future responsibilities that Paul outlines for the saints? How can we reconcile the truth that we have been washed, sanctified, and justified with the reality of ongoing sin in our lives?
