

Monday: Matthew 19:16–26

Why do you think the young man walked away sorrowful, even though he had followed the commandments? What does this passage teach us about the relationship between wealth and following Jesus? How might Jesus' challenge to "sell your possessions" apply to believers today?

Tuesday: Matthew 6:1–10

What does it mean to pray for God's kingdom to come and His will to be done? How can we align our daily lives with the priorities of God's kingdom? In what ways does starting prayer by focusing on God (not ourselves) shape our mindset?

Wednesday: James 2

Why do you think God places such value on the poor and marginalized? How does this verse challenge the world's views on success and worth? How can we as a community reflect God's heart for the poor?

Thursday: Proverbs 11:15-28

What does it mean to "trust in riches" in today's culture? How can we cultivate trust in God instead of material wealth? What might "flourishing like a green leaf" look like in real life?

Friday: Timothy 6:1-10

What is the difference between having money and loving money? How can we guard our hearts against the temptations that come with wealth? What role does contentment play in spiritual health and freedom?

Saturday: Mark 8:31-38

What does "taking up your cross" look like in daily life? Why is self-denial so central to following Jesus? What are some modern-day "crosses" believers are called to bear?
