Monday: Matthew 13:24–30 Why does Jesus say wheat and weeds grow together until the harvest? What does this teach about the present reality of God's Kingdom in the world? How can you remain faithful when evil seems to grow alongside good?

Tuesday: Matthew 13:31–35 Why does Jesus compare the Kingdom to a mustard seed and leaven? What do these parables teach about small beginnings and hidden growth? Where might God be growing something significant in your life that currently feels small?

Wednesday: Matthew 13:36–43 Why does Jesus clearly explain the meaning of the wheat and weeds? What does this passage teach about the future judgment and harvest? How does knowing the field belongs to God shape your hope and perseverance?

Thursday: Matthew 13:44–46 Why do the man and merchant joyfully give up everything for the treasure and pearl? What does this reveal about the value of God's Kingdom? What competes with treasuring Christ above everything else in your life?

Friday: Matthew 13:47–52 What does the parable of the net teach about the final separation of people? Why does Jesus repeatedly emphasize the coming judgment? How can you respond to Jesus with genuine faith instead of mere familiarity?

Saturday: Romans 8:18–25 How does this passage encourage believers living in a broken and mixed world? Why is hope essential while waiting for God's final restoration? How can trusting God's future harvest help you stay faithful today?
