Monday: Matthew 24:3–13 What exactly are the disciples asking Jesus in verse 3, and what does Jesus emphasize instead of giving them a timetable?

Tuesday: Matthew 24:23–31 What does Jesus say about false Christs and false prophets, and why do you think deception becomes such a prominent warning?

Wednesday: Matthew 24:36–44 Why is it significant that Jesus tells us we don't know the day or hour? How should that affect the way we think about predictions concerning Christ's return? What were people doing in the days of Noah?

Thursday: Matthew 24:45–51 What distinguishes the faithful servant from the wicked servant? What does each believe about the master's return? The wicked servant says, "My master is delayed."

Friday: Matthew 25:1–13 All ten virgins were waiting for the bridegroom, but only five were prepared. What does this teach us about the difference between knowing about Jesus' return and actually being ready for it?

Saturday: Matthew 25:14–30 What kinds of people does Jesus say the righteous noticed and cared for? What does this reveal about the kind of King Jesus is? Jesus says, "As you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me." Who are the people you are most likely to overlook, avoid, or dismiss?
